Santa's snowmaker brings holiday wonder to youths

The temperature had already dropped to 30 before the parade started at 6 p.m., and a steady cold wind out of the northwest made it feel even colder. The parade, sponsored by the Decatur Jaycees, followed its traditional route

down Second Avenue Southeast onto Lee Street and finishing at the end of Bank Street.

Donna Hill her and clan of nine children and grandchildren — which included Parkers, Clarkes and Hayeses — were bundled up in jackets, gloves, caps and blankets at Second Avenue and Gordon Drive at the parade start. They also has hot chocolate and hot popcorn to keep them warm.

"We're here to see Santa," Carol Parker said. "It's a tradition, We do this every year, for 15 years now. And when I was young, my mom used to take me with her to see it. My husband asked we how much longer I'm going to do this, and I said, 'I've got great grandkids after this to take.' "
